Koppenaar elected division chair for American Chemical Society

David Koppenaar, Chief Technology Officer at the Department of Energy's EMSL, has been elected to a national society-level position for the American Chemical Society. He will serve as Chair-Elect for the Analytical Chemistry Division of the society starting October 1, 2009, and succeed to Program Chair in 2010 and Chair in 2011.

The Analytical Chemistry Division is one of the largest of 34 divisions of the ACS, the world's largest scientific society. The division has approximately 9500 members, and its vision is "Improving people's lives through the transforming power of analytical chemistry and promoting the community of analytical scientists."

Koppenaar has been EMSL's Chief Technology Officer since 2007 and also manages the Biological Separations and Mass Spectrometry group at Pacific Northwest National Laboratory, who operates EMSL for the DOE. He is a PNNL Fellow as well as a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and the Royal Society of Chemistry (United Kingdom), and he holds nine U.S. and international patents for developing inductively coupled plasma-mass spectrometry instrumentation.
